Thank you for your letter of 22 March enclosing a cutting from the Daily Express about the venue for the FA Cup semi-final match, Liverpool v Nottingham Forest.

The choice of venue for these matches and the allocation of I tickets is entirely a matter for the football authorities. understand that the Football Association took account Liverpool's views in considering the venue for the match against Nottingham but decided that, in all the circumstances, the Sheffield Wednesday ground at Hillsborough was the most appropriate location. The arrangements for the allocation of tickets have been handled by the Sheffield Wednesday club who are staging the game on behalf of the Football Association. I gather, as suggested in the Daily Express article, that the allocations were made on the basis of police advice.



LARGE numbers of Liverpool fans DID make the journey across the Pennines without tickets.

Witnesses say they were allowed to make their way unchallenged right up to the Leppings Lane end—adding to the growing crowd and the chaos.

Total Taulkner, deputy chairman of the Trust, who saw Saturday's tragic scenes, and afraid there were a lot of fans who did ave tickets, hoping they could get in.

"Last year when the game was played at Hillsborough there was a checking of tickets taking place some distance away from the ground.

"Then the fans were filtred through to the ground. None of that happened on Saturday."

Dr John Williams, an expert on soccer crowds, was also at the game. He said: "You could see a lot of lads were looking for tickets a long way from the ground."

He added: "There was no attempt at the end of the road appproaching the ground to discriminate between ticket holders and non ticketholders. Supporters were going down as a common mass.

"There was no attempt to stop people without tickets getting to the turnstiles."

While the crush and the chaos increased outside the Lepping Lane end, the Nottingham Forest fans encountered no problems getting into Hillsborough.

Club secretary Peter White said the club had sold their full ticket allocation.

He said the Hillsborough Kop had accommodated the Forest supporters "quite comfortably."

He added: "We have had no reports of our fans having trouble trying to get into the ground."

The allocation of FA Cup tickets for major ties has long been a bone of contention on Merseyside.

A Liverpool trading standards department probe into the allocation of Cup Final tickets revealed abuse of FA rules when it was published last year.

The department claimed ticket shortages led to violent scenes outside Wembley with touts attacked and ticketless fans charging gates.

But semi-finals differ from the Wembley game—all tickets APE divided between the two clubs involved.
